MOVE-IN DAY

- There will be designated parking spots available in our parking garage for your convenience. There will be a 90 minute max for each coming resident. The garage door will be kept open that day for easy access. If the designated spaces should be taken, however, there is street parking located around Nordheim Court.
- Check-in will be located at the front office. Please review your move in time and date. The move in times are designed to make the process flow in a timely manner and to promote efficiency. We really appreciate your cooperation.
- Please make sure that you have your pro-rated rent check /money order with the added non-refundable \$200 fee at check-in time. The total amount due can be found on the first page of your leasing agreement. All checks are to be made out to Nordheim Court, credit cards and cash are not accepted.
- If you wish to obtain a parking space for the year please inquire about availabilities at the time of check in.



- We will also have a few hand trucks available for your use in exchange for some form of identification. Please keep in mind that there will be a steady flow of people checking in, we just ask that you manage your time accordingly.
